Regulation 2610

Discipline

Behavior Expectations

School personnel are charged by the Board of Education with the responsibility of maintaining proper discipline. Discipline administered should be appropriate to the violation, shall be administered without malice, and take into account the maturity level of the student.

The following steps will be utilized in most instances. However, the principal may progress to Step C or more if the situation warrants.

- A. Student/teacher conference to resolve the problem.
- B. Student/parent/teacher conference to resolve the problem.
- C. Student/parent/principal conference.
- D. Student is suspended from school up to a maximum of ten (10) school days.
- E. Three student suspensions from school during a school year may, at the discretion of the appropriate administrator, result in a disciplinary hearing before the Board of Education. At such time the Board may take disciplinary action up to and including expulsion from school. This step shall not prevent the appropriate building principal or the superintendent from bringing a student(s) before the Board for a disciplinary hearing after fewer than three student suspensions during a school year, if in the opinion of the appropriate administrator, the situation warrants.
- F. When the situation warrants, all steps may be bypassed and the student suspended pending a disciplinary hearing before the Board of Education who will take final action on the problem.

The aforementioned disciplinary procedures are meant to supplement the disciplinary alternatives available to school personnel and are not meant to preclude other methods of achieving good discipline.
