## **Regulation 2655**

### **Discipline**

### **Tardies**

This policy is designed to create consistency and uniformity in a school-wide tardy policy.

High School - Upon receiving the fifth tardy in a class during a semester, the student will receive one day of ISS to be assigned by the appropriate building principal. Each additional tardy in that class during the semester will be assigned another day of in-school-suspension.

In all cases, parents will be notified when a student receives his/her fourth tardy to any given class during a semester. In some instances, it is possible for a student to receive additional tardies prior to the building principal being able to notify the parent(s). In such cases, failure of a parent to receive notification prior to a student receiving his/her sixth or subsequent tardies in any given class will not be grounds for preventing the student from being disciplined as specified above.

Middle School - Upon receiving a third tardy to a given class during a quarter, the student will be given a day of in-school-suspension to be scheduled by the appropriate building principal. Each additional tardy in that class during the quarter will be assigned another accumulating day of in-school-suspension i.e. 4<sup>th</sup> tardy equals 2 days of ISS, 5<sup>th</sup> tardy equals 3 days, etc.

Also, students will be assigned ISS for total amount of tardies received during the quarter regardless of class. Any student who has 8 total tardies during the quarter will be assigned 1 day of ISS. If they receive a 9<sup>th</sup> tardy, 2 days of ISS will be assigned. These will also accumulate if the student receives additional tardies.

In all cases, parents will be notified when an student receives his/her second tardy to any given class during a quarter or his/her seventh tardy in all classes combined during a quarter. In some instances, it is possible for a student to receive additional tardies prior to the building principal being able to notify the parent(s). In such cases, failure of a parent to receive notification prior to a student receiving his/her third or subsequent tardies in any given class or his/her eighth or subsequent tardies in all classes combined will not be grounds for preventing the student from being disciplined as specified above.
