## **Regulation 2660**

### **Discipline**

### **Detention**

The appropriate building principal or the superintendent may assign a student or students to Saturday detention for the violation of school policy, rules, regulations, and/or misconduct which is prejudicial to good order and discipline.

It is the responsibility of the parent(s)/student to provide transportation to and from school in a timely and punctual manner. The student shall report to the detention area by 8:00 a.m. Students will be dismissed at 12:00 noon, except that any student who is one (1) to fifteen (15) minutes late will be assigned an extra one (1) to fifteen (15) minutes of detention time to be added on at the end of the Saturday detention period. Any student who is over fifteen minutes late shall be sent home and shall be assigned an additional Saturday detention.

If a student does not show up for assigned Saturday detention, another Saturday detention will be assigned. If a student fails to attend the second scheduled Saturday detention, a 3 day out-of-school suspension will be given.

Students shall observe the following Saturday detention rules:

- No sleeping –the student must keep his/her head up.
- Radios, tape players, etc. will not be permitted.
- Students shall come prepared and shall stay busy at all times. Failure to do so may result in additional work being assigned by the detention monitor.
- No food or drinks shall be permitted in the detention area.
- Talking and/or signaling is strictly forbidden between students.
- Additional rules as deemed necessary by the appropriate building principal/superintendent.

Violation of Saturday detention rules will not be tolerated and shall result in more stringent disciplinary measures being taken up to and including suspension from school.

Students will be given one(1) five (5) minute bathroom break.

Teachers serving as detention monitors will be appointed by the appropriate building principal or by the superintendent. Compensation for detention monitors shall be as approved by the Board of Education.
