Elementary Registration

Children who were 5 years of age by July 31, 2011 are eligible to attend kindergarten for the 2011-2012 school year. If you have not registered your child, you will need to do so in the elementary office. **Please bring a birth certificate, proof of physical residency, an up-to-date immunization record, social security card and a vision screening by a licensed optometrist when you register your child.**

Student Pick-up and Drop-off

I wanted to remind everyone of the procedures for picking up and dropping off students at the K-8 facility.

1. Parents are asked to please utilize the loading zone in front of the elementary office when bringing or picking up students. Teachers will be on duty to assist students and parents before and after school.
2. For those parents wishing to bring their students inside, parking will be available in the lot next to the music building, located across O'Dell Street. Parking will also be available in front of the gymnasium on O'Dell and in front of the elementary library on College.
3. The parking lot behind the gymnasium will be reserved for faculty and staff, with buses only unloading and loading at the door by the superintendent's office.

2011-2012 Breakfast and Lunch Prices

Free/reduced breakfast and lunch forms will be given to your child the first day of school. We are requesting all parents whose children qualify or who think that their children might qualify to fill these forms out, even if you do not wish your child to receive free or reduced breakfasts or lunches. We are making this request since the school receives additional state monies for every child who has qualified for free/reduced breakfasts or lunches, even if they choose not to eat at a free or reduced rate.

Federal regulations do not permit us to allow your child to eat free or at a reduced rate until your free/reduced application is returned to school and approved; except that families who are included on the list of those receiving AFDC benefits may be pre-approved.

Notification of Asbestos Reinspection and Surveillance

In compliance with the U.S. Environmental Agency (EPA) Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) of 1988, the Marionville R-9 School District performed inspections on each of the district's buildings for asbestos-containing material. The inspection findings and asbestos management plans have been on file in each school administrative office since that time. The EPA requires us to perform reinspection of the asbestos materials every three years. On August 22, 2011, accredited asbestos inspectors will perform the scheduled three year inspection and recommend actions we should take to safely manage each asbestos material in our buildings.

The results of the re-inspection will be on file in the management plan in the school's administrative office. Everyone is welcome to view these anytime during normal school hours (M-F, 8:00 a.m.-3:30 p.m.). The asbestos program manager, Dr. Larry L. Brown, is available to answer any questions you may have about asbestos in our buildings. All areas that contain asbestos, either friable or nonfriable, are monitored constantly and are checked by an accredited AHERA inspector every (6) six months to insure no deterioration of their condition. This inspection is performed to assure proper health and safety conditions for all employees and constituents of the school system.
